

GETTING TO KNOW: SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

ST. PETER:

Born Simon, Christ gave him the name Cephas, meaning Peter. Peter, in Hebrew, means the Rock. He was close to Jesus, witnessing the Transfiguration, staying with Jesus during the agony in the garden, and whose mother in law was healed by Jesus. Jesus said to him "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church" Matthew 16:17. Later, the Risen Jesus told Peter to feed His lambs and sheep. After the Ascension, Peter always took the leading role. He delivered the first sermon on Pentecost and received the first Gentiles into the church. He was a go getter and action taker even though he did not always do as Christ would intend for him and was rebuked for acting humanly rather than Godly. In the depths of his sorrow, Jesus looks on him and forgives him. He died bound to a cross in 67 A.D.


ST. PAUL:


Known as Saul prior to conversion, born in Tarsus to the son of Jewish parents who belonged to the tribe of Benjamin. He was as skilled tent maker and lived after the time of Christ's earthly life. Paul as Saul was one extremely notorious persecutor prior to his conversion. Christ made Saul completely blind and having to rely on others to help him to fully come to see and be a follower of Jesus. After his conversion, St. Paul took multiple missionary journeys where along the way, he was persecuted, forced to take secret flight and ultimately was jailed and then beheaded. Throughout his missions, he established Christian communities and churches.


Bellino's Fireworks Tent
