

Dear Friends in Christ,

Welcome to December! Welcome to the season of Advent! Where did the year go? Here we are, beginning the first week of Advent. Before we know it, it will be Christmas!

The word "Advent" derives from the Latin word "Adventus" which means "coming".

As we get ready for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord, the Church, in her wisdom, has given us these four weeks before Christmas to prepare spiritually for the coming of our Lord Jesus.

As we begin this first week, it is important for us to have a plan of action. Otherwise, it can be so easy to allow the busyness of the season to take over us, and suddenly find ourselves spiritually unprepared on Christmas Day.

I have a few suggestions for all of us, so that hopefully, when Christmas arrives, we will be spiritually ready and wanting for Jesus' birth.

### 1.PRAY DAILY

Spend 10-15 minutes each day in quiet prayer at the start of each day, if possible. If not, choose a time during the day that works best for you.

As we prepare our hearts spiritually for the coming of the Lord Jesus, the silence we spend with God during this busy time will help us to more clearly hear Him speak to us.

### 2.CONFESSION

Save the date: Wednesday, December 18, 7:00 p.m.

One of the best ways for us to get ready for the birthday of our Savior is to go to Confession.

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, our Lord Jesus does not only wash away our sins, He also gives us the graces that we need to reject sin and to stay close to Him.

Through Jesus' mercy and forgiveness, He makes us a new creation in Him!

We will have at least 5-6 priests here to hear Confessions on December 18. As you know, this is a very busy time for priests too. Please make their time worthwhile by coming to Confession!

### 3. DECEMBER 15

What is this other date? I invite you to make it your goal to finish all your shopping, baking and decorating by December 15.

This will allow you 10 days to fully focus on preparing your heart for the coming of Jesus.

Former parishioners and friends who have accepted this as a challenge and who have tried this out, have really appreciated it.

Let us make a commitment to make this Advent season a meaningful one so that Christmas will truly be spiritual special.




