

1. NEBRASKA WALK FOR LIFE

2. STEUBENVILLE YOUTH CONFERENCE

We hope to bring some youth from our parish to the Steubenville Youth Conference in Springfield, Missouri, from Friday, July 17 to Sunday, July 19. The Steubenville Youth Con-

ference is like a mini-NCYC. There will be keynote speakers, Mass, Confession, Eucharistic Adoration, and small group sessions. We will be going together with the rest of the groups from across our Archdiocese of Omaha. All youth who will be incoming high school freshman through graduating seniors are welcome to sign up. A deposit of \$50 is needed upon sign up. The total cost is yet to be determined, though we hope that most of the cost can be funded through donations and fundraisers. In the 12 years that I have been to the Steubenville Youth Conference, I have witnessed the Holy Spirit work in so many beautiful and powerful ways in the youth who have participated. 3. CELEBRATING AMERICAN SAINTS

This past week, the Catholic Church honored two America saints who played a great influence in the life of the Catholic Church here in the United States: St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (Jan. 4) and St. John Neumann (Jan. 5).

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was born in New York City in 1774 into an affluent, Episcopalian family. She and her husband, William, had five children. However, when they suffered a loss of fortune, they decided to go and stay with Catholic friends in Italy. Six weeks into the trip, William's health deteriorated and he passed away. By then, Elizabeth had come to grow in her love for Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist and desired to become a Catholic. Despite knowing that she would suffer abandonment, ridicule and be shunned by her Episcopalian family, relatives and friends, she converted and became Catholic in 1804. Elizabeth founded a school for girls. With approval from Bishop Carroll of Baltimore, she formed a new religious community that taught in the school. Elizabeth laid the foundation of the parochial school system in the United States. She died in Emmitsburg, Maryland on January 4, 1821. She was canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1975.

St. John Naumann was a Catholic priest from Bohemia. He attended school and seminary in his country. By the age of 24, he was fluent in six languages. After completing his seminary studies in 1835, he was hoping to become a priest. Due to the large number of priests in his country, his application was declined. In 1836, he traveled to the United States, hoping to be ordained to the holy priesthood. Bishop John Dubois of the Diocese of New York ordained him three weeks later. Father John Naumann (his name was changed to Neumann) worked with German immigrants. Despite his short stature, he was able to ride a horse, on which he would travel around for his ministry. Father Neumann joined the Redemptorist Order and became the fourth Bishop of Philadelphia. He founded the first Catholic diocesan school system in the United States. Bishop John Neumann died at the age of 48 on January 5, 1860. He was canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1977.

Both St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. John Neumann are saints today because they did God's will in their lives. All of us are called to be saints! What are you doing to listen to God's voice each day? How much are you following His Will for you in your life?

<u>Prayer:</u> Lord Jesus, thank you for St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. John Neumann. Help me to make time for you in prayer each day. Grant me the grace to be attentive to Your voice and the humility to desire to do Your will, so that I, too, may one day be a saint.

PILGRIMAGE TO MEDJUGORJE (meh-ju-go-ria)

I would like to personally invite you to join me on a pilgrimage to Medjugorje from **November 27 to December 5, 2020**. I have be to Medjugorje four times. Each time, it has been a powerful and moving experience. Medjugorje has given me a deeper love for Jesus and our Mother Mary. It has also positively impacted my priesthood in many ways.

The Vatican has given permission for dioceses and parishes to organize pilgrimages to Medjugorje. We already have a few parishioners signed up! We will be going with Stella Mar Pilgrimages. They produced the movies *Apparition Hill* and *Where There Is Darkness*. (You might remember the latter movie being promoted in our parish this past summer). The cost is around \$2,735 per person, and includes airfare, lodging, breakfasts and lunches.
